What Does the Rash Look Like?

A red, blotchy rash which begins 2-4 days after other symptoms have started. The rash typically starts first on the face and upper body.

What Are Symptoms of Measles?

- 1. Fever as high as 103-105 degrees
- 2. Cough
- 3. Runny nose (Coryza)
- 4. Red, watery eyes (Conjunctivitis)
- 5. Rash

Measles Information

- Get your kids vaccinated! The first dose of MMR is given on or after their 1st birthday. They will get the second dose of MMR at age 4-6 years.
- If you do not know if you are protected against the measles, call and talk to your doctor.
- Vaccinating yourself not only protects you but also your family and other loved ones.
