# 121 Arizonans honored by The Arizona Partnership for Immunization for raising immunization rates, saving lives

MESA, AZ – The Arizona Partnership for Immunization (TAPI) honored 121 individuals, organizations, and initiatives at the annual "Big Shots for Arizona Awards Ceremony" on Tuesday, April 15, 2025. The theme was *Celebrating over 30 years of Science, Education, and Advocacy*. More than 250 people attended the event at the DoubleTree by Hilton Phoenix/Mesa as part of the 2025 Arizona Immunization Conference.

Presenting the award prizes were Nicole Witt, MPH, Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS); Dr. Jodi Carter, Arizona Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics; James Washington, CEO of TAPI; and Rebecca Nevedale, TAPI Coalition Member.

Guest speakers included Debbie McCune Davis, former Executive Director of TAPI, and Machrina Leach, TAPI Founder and Immunization Nurse with the Maricopa County Department of Public Health as a panel discussion on "Celebrating our History and Looking Towards the Future."

Lifetime Achievement Award Dr. Bob England's legacy in Arizona's immunization landscape is undeniable, with his strategic vision and tireless advocacy directly strengthening vaccine policies and provider networks across the state. His data-driven approach has not only improved childhood immunization rates but also laid the groundwork for long-term public health improvements, setting a powerful precedent for future leaders. Dr. Bob's leadership during the COVID-19 crisis exemplified his ability to navigate public health emergencies while ensuring that immunization efforts remained a priority. His work with TAPI and the Arizona Department of Health Services led to critical reforms that have revitalized the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program, reversing the decline in immunization access. For his decades of dedication, resilience through crises, and transformative role in reshaping Arizona's immunization infrastructure, Dr. Bob England's impact will resonate for generations to come (despite 4 retirements), making him a most deserving recipient of the 2025 TAPI Big Shot Award.

## **2025** Daniel T. Cloud Outstanding Practice Awards (by category)

Receiving Daniel T. Cloud Outstanding Practice Awards are healthcare providers that have achieved certain minimum coverage level of their infant and teen patients. A pediatric surgeon by profession, Dr. Cloud served as Chief of Surgery at Arizona Crippled Children's Hospital and Chief of Staff at Good

Samaritan Hospital. In 1981, he was elected to a one-year term as president of the American Medical Association. He served as TAPI's board chair since its inception in 1993 until his death in 2010.
